Needles in the Camel's Eye examines how the consumption of images is becoming increasingly inseparable from their digital means of production and dissemination. The show focuses on a group of artists that present the stability of mass-produced images as abstract and tenuous. Rather than try to emulate the ostensible "immateriality" of digital experience, these artists reorient pictures produced for scientific, commercial, or artistic purposes both materially and spatially. In so doing, they exert pressure on digital production's formal and conceptual legibility and leave their works in the unresolved space between networked connectivity and material immediacy. While deftly navigating art historical, theoretical, and technological discourses, the show's participants construct discursive constellations that reflect the evolving approaches toward artistic production in the face of technological omnipresence. The exhibition's goal is not for the viewer to extract cohesive meaning; instead, it attempts to reflect imagistic agency in relation to an increasingly mediated and frenetic society.

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
